Education at Westminster cultivates an environment in which diversity of opinions is respected and visitors as well as members are nurtured with scripturally-based curriculum. Some offerings are geared for "age and stage" while others are intentionally inter-generational. Educational opportunities include Sunday school classes, adult and youth Bible studies, men's and women's circles, Disciple study groups, fellowship groups, interest groups and retreats which explore current topics relevant to the church.

Members, pastors and staff are called to support each other in mutual ministry.

We are committed to vibrant Christian discipleship which engages us in mission to the larger community and greater world.

We are active in the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly. Our music ministry draws on the talents of our members and the community at large. Participation in children and youth programs is enthusiastic and increasing. Small groups provide opportunities for strengthening faith, building relationships and sharing spirituality in our growing congregation. Our faith is lived out with commitment and enthusiasm in the belief that God acts in powerful ways to reveal God's will for our lives.

How will this position help you to reach your vision and mission goals:

Equipping our church for ministry entails organizing and leading a community of care when individual members are in need due to major changes in life circumstances. Additionally, our church members need to feel both welcomed into our fellowship and valued for the gifts they bring to our congregation.

The Associate Pastor for Congregational Care provides personal care and support to members of our congregation and to our friends. This minister counsels, communicates, organizes and guides the congregation and other church staff as we seek for appropriate ways to provide care to others in a loving, sensitive and compassionate way. This Associate Pastor works with all members to understand their unique gifts and invite them into serving our church and community in ways that will be most beneficial to the recipients of these gifts and most fulfilling to the givers.

First and foremost will be this person's ability to establish solid relationships of trust with those needing care and giving care. Our church has a congregational care steering committee and ten different care teams that need leadership and coordination in identifying, communicating and responding to needs in a timely fashion. This person must be someone to whom others can turn to for counsel, comfort and support. This person must be wise in respecting individual confidentiality while still communicating well with those who will also be depended upon to provide care.

This person will need to be both compassionate and demonstrate a high level of spiritual maturity, able to witness confidently to how God is working through our congregation and our world, sometimes in the midst of great pain and suffering. Demonstrated wisdom in judgment, decision making, and conflict resolution will be essential in growing the trust necessary for effective ministry.

What specific tasks, assignments, and program areas will this person have responsibility?

Providing pastoral care: supporting members during challenging and joyful times, building relationships and responding to needs, and connecting members to ministries.

Ministering to the needs of older adults: Addressing particular care and connection needs, arranging ongoing programs for active seniors, encouraging intergenerational participation when appropriate.

Fostering a wide array of care teams: for example, hospital visitation, prayer requests, response for immediate needs, communion at home, and visitation and relationships in a variety of living arrangements.

Developing Congregational Care educational programs: for example, Sunday School offerings, divorce adjustment groups, healthy living initiatives, and marriage enrichment.

Coordinating and communicating: developing systems for sharing appropriate information, maintaining an excellent working relationship with co-workers, and providing guidance for the Congregational Care Steering Committee.

Serving as part of pastoral team for entire church: preaching and serving as liturgist in worship, teaching, and serving in baptisms, weddings and funerals, participating in Presbytery.
