

## THE BAPTISMAL RITE

The Apostles' Creed: The oldest surviving baptismal liturgy, dating from around the year 200 C.E., describes the candidate for baptism standing in water and affirming the faith by responding to three questions. Each question corresponds to one person of the Trinity. The Paschal Candle is symbolic of Christ's death and

resurrection. The Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, is our Paschal sacrifice. The Paschal Candle also symbolizes the light of the risen Christ, shining in the world. The use of this symbol dates from the early days of the Church. New Christians were given a lighted candle, symbolic of their having died and been raised to new life in Christ through baptism. Each family is given a Paschal Candle to use annually on the anniversary of the baptism as a symbolic reminder of God's gift of redemption and new life in Jesus Christ.

ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICE ON FEBRUARY 14, 2018: The celebration of Ash Wednesday centers on both our human mortality and the confession of sin before God. The Service of Imposition of Ashes maintains this dual focus in light of God's redeeming love in Jesus Christ. The ashes on the forehead are a sign of our humanity and a reminder of our mortality as well as a mark (the cross) that identifies us as those who in Jesus Christ are forgiven. Please make plans now to attend the worship service on Ash Wednesday, February 14, beginning at 7:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary.

CENTERING PRAYER: AN INVITATION TO PRAY IN LENT: Westminster has had a Centering Prayer weekly gathering for a number of years, which has brought strength and power to many. "Be still and know that I am God," says the Psalmist. Come and be still, 9:00 – 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday mornings, as we gather in sacred space by candlelight and cross, in the presence of God and one another. The half hour begins with a brief passage of scripture or uplifting word from ancient and contemporary spiritual guides (e.g., Thomas Keating, Henri Nouwen, Hildegard of Bingen), followed by twenty minutes in silence, and concluding with a version of the Lord's Prayer. Come, be still this Lent, and grow deeper in your relationship with God.
